As a long-standing resident of Arbutus Ridge for over 12 years, I am deeply concerned about the potential impacts this development may have on our community. The proposed building's scale and density are incongruent with the existing neighborhood character, which predominantly consists of single-family homes, duplexes, and townhouses. There are currently no apartment buildings or structures exceeding three stories in the immediate vicinity, and introducing such a development would set a concerning precedent for future projects. Furthermore, the addition of commercial space is unnecessary, given the existing amenities in the area, including Starbucks, Subway, Choices Market, and several local restaurants, which adequately serve the community's needs. The proposed development's footprint appears disproportionate to the lot size, potentially leading to issues such as reduced green space, increased traffic congestion, and strain on local infrastructure. These factors could adversely affect the quality of life for current residents and alter the neighborhood's established character. I urge the Council to consider these concerns and reject the rezoning application for 3215 Macdonald Street. Preserving the integrity and heritage of Arbutus Ridge is paramount, and any new developments should align with the existing community framework, focusing on low-density housing options that respect the area's character.
