



The small VGH park on the corner of W 13th and Willow is already overcrowded supporting the neighbouring apartment blocks and will be even more crowded once the two buildings between Heather and Willow on W 13th have been completed. There is already very limited parking in the area and the surrounding roads are already congested. It needs places for families. Employers need all kinds of employees - that includes moms and dads. Right now, families are forced to move well outside of the city, making commuting to Vancouver jobs untenable. By building more of these high rises, you are limiting to vancouver jobs untenable. By building more of these high of community with high-rise anonymous neighbourhoods that will attract a mix of people/families and create a strong sense of community. Destroying existing low-rise, dense neighbourhoods that have strong feelings of community with high-rise anonymous neighbour is contributing to the unravelling of civility in Vancouver. Compare the vibrant west end with the dead-zone ghetto of Camble/SW Marine. Other world class cities (Paris, London, NY) manage density without excessive height. 4 - 6 Storey buildings are still human-scale: you know your neighbours, you can chat with them out your window or off your balcony. Why can't Vancouver be like this? Why destroy quiet tree-lined streets with concrete monoliths that don't provide gereen space (look at this plansome anemic trees and concrete benches on a concrete plaza? Uber waiting area more like it) Dak street, a hugely busy arterial road gets 3-storey townhouses, but quiet lifte side streets get 2.21 storey towns that bear no relationship to the streetscape around them? No-this must be reconsidered. I get that land is expensive and developers need to build up to recoup their investment. However, land prices will fail if zoning does not allow dozens of storeys, and then developers will be able to afford to build housing that is more in line with what we want.
