However, my concerns about 1780 East Broadway is that community needs are not being met. Specifically, the information given:  - does not provide enough child care spaces (37 is miniscule and nowhere close to what families in the new towers nor the surrounding community needs) - the 1,044 rental units are not specified as rent control or subsidized; if they are all market rent, then it does not serve what the community needs; I am asking for rent control or subsidy for half the units - the area around the Skytrain an transit stations are notoriously concrete-clad; we need more trees and greenery to offset the carbon generated by the three new towers and to manage climate change by providing a canopy - supportive healthcare or services in conjunction with the commercial space (the existing Robert Lily centre is not enough) - increased capacity for schools in the neighborhood to align with the increased density (e.g. there is still no school in the Olympic Village despite the increased densification since 2010) - beautification of the area that includes the other corners and sides of Commercial and Broadway (see comment re: concrete but also that the area is constantly under-cleaned, under-maintained, while over-used)  Please let me know how these community needs will be addressed with this proposed rezoning and resulting densification that is being planned.
