SUBJECT: 2025 Quarterly Capital Budget Adjustments and Closeouts

#### Recommendations

A. THAT Council approve Capital Plan and Capital Budget adjustments as outlined in this report and Appendices B and C, which will result in:

- a. An increase of \$25.4 million to the 2023-2026 Capital Plan; and
- b. An increase of \$32 million to the Multi-Year Capital Project Budgets.
- B. THAT, as part of the Capital Budget closeout process, Council approves the closeout of 1 completed project with surplus/deficit exceeding \$0.2 million, as outlined in this report and Appendix D.

## **Purpose and Executive Summary**

As part of the City's Capital Budget process, the Council considers Capital Budget adjustments quarterly. This streamlines the Capital Budget process and reduces the number of standalone Capital Budget-related reports submitted to the Council for approval of capital funding and expenditures. The budget adjustments included in this report are limited to addressing new and emerging project requests, updates in project scope and cost estimates, utilization of additional external funding received, and administrative adjustments that were not known at the time of the approval of the 2025 Capital Budget.

This report proposes an increase of \$25.4 million to the 2023-2026 Capital Plan and a net increase of \$32 million to the Multi-Year Capital Project Budgets to fund new or existing project budgets. The current total approved Multi-Year Capital Project Budgets for all open projects is \$3.8 billion. A total of 31 projects (\$166 million) were completed in the first two quarters of 2025, out of which one projects were closed out with a surplus/deficit exceeding \$0.2 million.

## **Council Authority/Previous Decisions**

The 2023-2026 Capital Plan was approved by the Council in June 2022. The plan presents a comprehensive overview of planned City capital investments in infrastructure and amenities across various service categories, along with the associated funding strategy and debt capacity for the capital investment priorities over the four years.

The 2023-2026 Capital Plan Mid-term Update (MTU) report was approved by the Council on July 23, 2024, and this report included adjustments to the Capital Plan required to support the delivery of existing projects underway and manage emerging capital needs, including cost escalations and external opportunities.

Council approved the 2025 Capital Budget on December 10, 2024.

Following the City's Capital Budget Policy, proposed adjustments to the Capital Plan and the Capital Budgets and proposed closeouts of completed projects with surpluses or deficits greater than \$200,000 are presented to the Council for approval.

## **City Manager's Comments**

The City Manager concurs with the foregoing recommendations.

## **Context and Background**

Capital budget adjustments are recommended throughout the year to reflect new external funding, the progression of projects through planning, design, and construction phases, and reallocations of project budgets based on current cost estimates.

### **Discussion**

## **Capital Plan Summary**

The 2023-2026 Capital Plan currently stands at \$3.9 billion, with \$3.2 billion of city-led capital and \$0.7 billion of in-kind projects. Out of the \$3.2 billion city-led Capital Plan funding, \$2.2 billion has been allocated to approved multi-year project budgets.

**Appendix A** provides an overview of the 2023-2026 Capital Plan, after adjustments proposed in this report.

## **Highlights of proposed major adjustments**

## 1. Revised Cost Estimates

The adjustments below will impact the 2023-2026 Capital Plan and corresponding multi-year project budgets in line with revised cost estimates, largely driven by cost escalations and changes in scope. These cost escalations are driven by higher prices to procure materials, supply chain disruptions, and unforeseen labor and sub-trades shortages.

1 a) Granville Bridge Structural Repair and Recoating (Phase 2) (Decrease to 2023-26 Capital Plan: \$4.1 million; Decrease to Multi-Year Project Budget: \$6.8 million)

The budget adjustment is to decrease the Capital Plan and project budget for the Granville Bridge program. The scope of work has been deferred to future Capital Plan(s) due to higher-than-anticipated bid costs. A portion of this funding will be reallocated to the other

major projects related to the Granville Bridge. (original cost: \$35.5 million; revised cost estimate: \$28.7 million).

## 1 b) Vancouver Aquatic Center

(Increase to 2023-26 Capital Plan: \$22.5 million; No Impact on the Multi-year Project Budget)
The details of the Vancouver Aquatic Center can be found in Appendix C.

1 c) Vancouver Landfill Phase 5 South Closure Implementation (No change to the 2023-26 Capital Plan; Increase to the Multi-Year Project Budget: \$5.2 million)

The budget adjustment is to increase the project budget to address cost escalations due to higher tender prices, mainly due to loading, hauling, placement, and compaction of grading. The budget request will be funded through the Phase 5 North closure project, which will be partially deferred to future Capital Plan(s). (original cost: \$20.5 million; revised cost estimate: \$25.7 million).

## 2. New and Emerging Projects

The adjustments below will create new multi-year project budgets to address emerging needs.

## 2 a) Nelson Forcemain Repair

(No change to the 2023-26 Capital Plan; Increase to Multi-Year Project Budget: \$7.5 million)

The budget adjustment is to increase the project budget to reflect emergency repairs for the Nelson Forcemain, in order to support the housing development at 1010 Expo Blvd. The emergency repair work is a result of a survey conducted by BC Housing. The budget request will be funded from the Sewer 2023-2026 Capital Plan.

## 3. Delivering the 2023—2026 Capital Plan

The adjustments below will allocate the funding remaining in the 2023-2026 Capital Plan to capital projects and programs to deliver the scope/outcomes outlined in the plan.

## 3 a) 2023-2026 Sewer and Water Connection

(Increase to 2023-26 Capital Plan: \$1.2 million; Increase to Multi-Year Project Budget: \$9.3 million)

This budget adjustment request is to increase the multi-year project budget by \$9.3 million from Water and Sewer Connection Programs, to reflect revenues from ongoing development work collected during the period. Revenues are driven by residential and commercial construction.

## 3 b) 2023-26 New sports courts & skate parks

(No change to the 2023-26 Capital Plan; Increase to Multi-Year Project Budget: \$1.3 million)

This budget adjustment request is to increase the multi-year project budget by \$1.3 million for Slocan Park Playground renewal to incorporate a new sport court and a new skate amenity.

## 4. New Funding (Grants, Donations, Governmental Funding, Other Revenues, etc.)

The adjustments below result in the incorporation of new funding into the 2023-26 Capital Plan and the multi-year capital project budget, as applicable.

4 a) 2023-2026 Landfill Gas Collection Infrastructure: CleanBC Grant (Increase to 2023-26 Capital Plan: \$1.2 million; Increase to Multi-Year Project Budget: \$2.3 million)

This budget adjustment is to reflect the successful award of the CleanBC Grant. The budget increase is to accommodate the scope outlined in the CleanBC grant agreement, which

includes implementation of new smart well devices and procurement of a contractor for gas works construction, including horizontal gas collectors.

4 b) Renewal of Marine Structures: Insurance Settlement (Increase to 2023-26 Capital Plan: \$1.1 million; Increase to Multi-Year Project Budget: \$1.1 million)

The budget adjustment is to increase the multi-year budget to reflect an insurance settlement for Jericho Pier storm damage. These funds will support costs for Jericho Pier repairs that are currently underway and other marine structure renewal projects in 2025.

## 5. Administrative Adjustments

The adjustments in this section include consolidation or realignment of funding spread across various project accounts to enable administrative efficiency. The adjustments do not result in any changes to the project scope.

**Appendix B** provides details on all the Multi-Year Capital Project budget adjustments recommended in this report.

## **Capital Closeouts**

As per the Capital Budget Policy, proposed closeouts of completed projects with surpluses or deficits greater than \$0.2 million are presented to the Council for approval. A total of 31 projects/programs with Multi-Year Capital Project Budgets totalling \$166 million were closed in the first half of 2025. 1 project was closed with a surplus/deficit exceeding \$0.2 million.

**Appendix D** provides for Council approval the summary of the capital project closed in the first two quarters of 2025 with a surplus or deficit greater than \$0.2 million.

**Appendix E** provides for Council information a summary of capital projects closed in the first two quarters that are funded from voter-approved capital funding.

#### **Financial Implications**

This report proposes an increase of \$25.4 million to the 2023-2026 Capital Plan and a net increase of \$32 million to the Multi-Year Capital Project Budgets. The current total approved Multi-Year Capital Project Budgets for all open projects is \$3.8 billion and this report proposes an increase of \$32 million for new or increased capital project budgets. For projects completed in the first two quarters for a total of \$166 million, 1 project was closed out with a surplus/deficit exceeding \$0.2 million.

## **Legal Implications**

There are no legal implications associated with this report's recommendations.

The remainder of funding in the 2023-2026 Capital Plan will be allocated over 2025 and 2026 through the Annual Budget and Quarterly adjustment process, aligning with the project schedule and program delivery strategy. The following includes details on some of the service categories which has the largest funding to be allocated:

- **Community Facilities:** Out of the remaining funding, a significant portion is designated for the delivery of the Vancouver Aquatic Centre project.
- **Childcare:** In addition to the delivery of ongoing childcare programs, another major project that the City will be working on in the 2025-2026 time period includes the construction of a new Childcare centre at East Fraser Community Centre.

## **APPENDIX C: Vancouver Aquatic Centre Renewal**

### PROJECT BACKGROUND

Built in 1974, VanSplash (2019) identified the Vancouver Aquatic Centre (VAC) as nearing the end of its functional lifespan and a high priority for renewal in the 2023-2026 Capital Plan. The Capital Plan identified a phased approach for the facility's renewal, phase 1 renewal of the 50-meter competition pool and dive tank and phase 2 the addition of a leisure aquatic facility, pending future funding. During the 2022 municipal election, a plebiscite vote secured \$103 million for the replacement, renewal or rehabilitation of the VAC and Council approved \$37 million in the 2023-2026 Capital Plan for a total \$140 million project budget.

In late 2024, the project team completed the feasibility study phase; the work included site analysis, renewal options, and preliminary cost estimates. The technical team explored various 50-meter pool configurations, including expansion into the adjacent Sunset Beach Park, but ultimately determined this approach would not be viable. Further, the feasibility study highlighted the importance of renewing the facility within the existing building footprint, therefore eliminating opportunities for expansion and Phase 2. The study concluded that prioritizing a 50-meter pool within the existing building footprint would be at the expense of all other aquatic/leisure components.

The recommended project scope, approved at the March 31st Park Board Meeting, meets the greatest aquatic service need for all users and maintains or improves most of the VAC's existing programming. The renewal proposes a 25-m lap pool, dive pool, leisure pool, and hot pool on the main deck. Accessed directly off the pool deck are steam and sauna rooms, a deck viewing area, a teaching room, and family and gendered change room facilities. The fitness centre is relocated to street level, adjacent to the lobby and reception; also located at street level are public washrooms, a multipurpose space and administrative offices. The result is a hybrid of a 25-meter swim and a full complement of dive competition program, with an increase in community and leisure design considerations. The recommended program maintains or enhances all existing services (except the 50-meter pool) and offers more diverse programming opportunities. This approach eliminates the need for a phased approach, maintains as many current services as possible, and responds to a broader range of community needs.

As a result of the recent global economic volatility and introduction of trade tariffs, there might be potential impact on the prices of essential supplies and materials, which could increase the cost of construction for this project significantly. This might have an impact on the overall project budgets and timelines.

## PROJECT COST AND FUNDING

The project cost is currently estimated at \$ 175M. In addition to the original base funding of \$140M included in the 2023-2026 Capital Plan, an additional \$35M has been sourced through reprioritization from existing projects and available funding in 2023-2026 Capital Plan.

- \$13.9M from unallocated West End CAC
- \$7.5M from Emerging Priorities Debenture
- \$5M from Capital Facilities Reserve
- \$35M Total
