I live in Vancouver, BC, Canada, and I have been here for a long time. I survive on my monthly PWD (Persons with Disabilities) income, which is my only support from the government, along with quarterly GST/HST payments.  Even though I have worked hard all my life, I have faced constant barriers. I finished college and university, but when I tried to go back for more training, I was told I had already been in school too long and should instead go to an employment training centre. But the government, City Hall, and the mayor have not built proper programs or centres for people with disabilities. Because of this, I had nowhere else to go, and no chance to return to school.  I have tried very hard to find a job. I applied to Walmart, Superstore, Save-On-Foods, London Drugs, and many other places. I sent my resume many times but never heard back. I believe I was rejected because of my disability and the lack of proper support for people like me.  Life in Vancouver is very expensive. Food, drinks, transportation, and housing costs keep going up. I try to enjoy activities, but there are not enough programs for older adults or for people with disabilities. I love to explore new areas and research opportunities, but I feel trapped because nothing ever changes.  I have also experienced unsafe situations. Once, when I went to my bank in Chinatown, a strange man followed me inside. I was scared and told the bank staff. They had to call security to remove him. This made me feel unsafe and ignored.  When I tried to withdraw my full amount of money, the bank treated me unfairly. They charged me fees, refused to give me all my money, and did not listen to my questions. I felt discriminated against because of my disability.
