

SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES (BUSINESS LICENCE HEARING)

NOVEMBER 18, 2025

A Special Meeting of the Council of the City of Vancouver was held on Tuesday, November 18, 2025, at 9:31 am, in the Council Chamber, Third Floor, City Hall, for the purpose of holding a Business Licence Hearing to consider the decision of the Deputy Chief Licence Inspector to not support the issuance of a 2025 business licence ("Business Licence") to Arya Mahdavi-Baramchi (the "Applicant") for a short-term rental accommodation at 605-1050 Burrard Street (the "Premises"). This Special Council meeting was convened in person and via electronic means as authorized by Part 14 of the *Procedure By-law* and the *Vancouver Charter*.

Arya Mahdavi-Baramchi was assisted by Persian interpreter, Sara Molavi.

Mr. LeBlanc provided opening remarks and reviewed relevant legislation as set out in section 275 of the *Vancouver Charter* and section 25.1(3) of the City of Vancouver's *Licence By-law No.* 4450.

In support of the allegations set out in the evidence brief, Mr. LeBlanc called Arlina Urloiu, Deputy Chief Licence Inspector, as a witness for the City of Vancouver.

The Applicant's Counsel also directed questions to the witness.

• The unit is not the Applicant's principal residence unit as defined by the City of Vancouver's *Licence Bylaw No. 4450*.
