- By-Law # 5654




The 4 Pillars of Emergency Management

Main goal is to save lives, preserve the environment and protect property and the economy







What is B.C.E.R.M.S.?


British Columbia Emergency Response Management System

- A comprehensive management system used across BC for managing emergencies - based on Incident Command System (ICS)
 - ICS Site level response
 - BCERMS Site support
- A means of ensuring an integrated, coordinated and organized response and recovery at all levels









City's Commitment to Emergency Planning

- 1990 City Council identified Emergency Preparedness as one of the City's seven corporate priorities
- 2000 City Council approved a 10 year program to:
 - Upgrade infrastructure
 - Enhance the City's overall disaster preparedness
 - · Currently in year 8 of the program
- City Council's proactive approach to emergency management has been studied internationally



Office of Emergency Management

- Plan and prepare for emergencies and disasters (consequence management)
- Coordinate all City departments in supporting response to major emergencies
- Support Corporate Management Team and Mayor and Council with policy direction and decision making

 - Provide for Safety & Health of all Responders
 - Save Lives
 - Reduce Suffering
 - Protect Public Health
 - Protect Government Infrastructure
