Dog Off-leash Update

- Currently 32 off-leash parks in Vancouver
- Off-leash issues arise for a number of reasons:
 - Denser urban neighbourhoods
 - Changes to hours to address community needs
 - Conflicting use of park space
- Dog Strategy Task Force established in May 2006
 - Changes to off-leash parks put on hold
 - Reported back in December 2007
 - No consensus among Task Force members

• Continue to design off-leash areas in new parks, especially in high density neighbourhoods

Devonian Harbour Park

- Serves a high density community
- Consultation site signs and notice on Park Board website in September
- 33 comments received 26 in favour, 7 opposed
- Petition for Coal Harbour site is supportive
- Main issue was potential conflict on adjacent pedestrian/cycle path
- Secondary issues were impact on wildlife, noise, animal waste and lack of enforcement
- Designated area may reduce off-leash activity in other areas
- Proposed hours 6 am to 10 am & 5 pm to 10 pm
- Signs and enforcement are key to success




New Off-leash Areas Requiring Board Approval

Stanley Park - Second Beach Area

- Serves a high density community
- Consultation site signs and notice on Park Board website in September
- 26 comments received 25 in favour, 1 opposed
- No negative comments were received
- May take pressure off "small dog area" and reduce off-leash activity in other areas
- Proposed hours 6 am to 10 am & 5 pm to 10 pm
- Signs and enforcement are key to success

Fraser River Park

- Popular off-leash destination
- Large passive area and water access are appealing
- Current off-leash hours 6 am to 10 am & 5 pm to 10 pm
- Petition received asking for all day access
- Consultation site signs and notice on Park Board website
- 112 responses 88 in favour, 24 opposed
- Winter hours are an issue in late afternoon and evening
- Adjustment of hours:
 - October 1 to April 30 off-leash all day
 - ❖ May 1 to September 30 6 am to 10 am & 5 pm to 10 pm
- Signs and enforcement are key to success

 - ❖ September 1 to June 30 off-leash all day
